Digging Deeper

1. In 1 Corinthians 15: 12-19, Paul confidently asserts that without the literal resurrection of Jesus our faith is useless. Discuss why this is true.
2. In Paul's day, he was mocked for believing in the resurrection (Acts 17:32 & 26:8). Today, what is the general attitude among non-Christians regarding the resurrection?
3. **Read 1 Cor. 15:20-26.** Tony asserted that we should not see "Dying and going to heaven" as the pinnacle of our salvation. How does this passage in 1 Cor. 15 inform that statement?
4. Tony also asserted that Christians tend to focus on our souls/spirits being saved with a deemphasis on the body's eventual salvation; why do you suppose we have done this?
5. Read 1 Cor. 15:50-58 and use your sanctified imagination regarding what our resurrected bodies will be like.
6. Last, talk through the implications that 1 John 2:28-3:3 has for our lives today.
