Digging Deeper into Romans 5:1-11 (part 1)

Read Romans 5:1-11

1. Romans 5:1 informs us that we now “have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.” Discuss the different nuances of the word *peace* based on what Tony taught.

- Absence of emotional turmoil?
- Absence of enmity and conflict?
- Presence of Shalom?

2. Shalom included the first two nuances but it also infers a *restored relationship* with God and an ensuing *rest* that follows. This can be seen in the concept of “formally alienated” but now “reconciled” as described in Colossians 1:19-23 and Romans 5:8-11

3. Carefully read through Romans 5:6-11 and list out all the descriptive terms Paul uses to describe us prior to becoming Christians and then identify and discuss all the terms that describe God and what He did to reconcile us.

4. Go around the room and read the following passages that give us our marching orders regarding peace with one another (Rom. 12:18; 14:19; 2Cor. 13:11; Heb. 12:14; Matt. 5:19).
