Ice Breaker: Like all words, "hope" has a range of meanings. Give some examples of how it is used today.

Read Romans 5:1-5

In the Bible "hope" can be used to communicate a desire that may or may not happen (see Romans 15:24); but in the context of Romans 5 it refers to *a certain expectation of what has not happened yet*. That certain expectation is based on *Who God is* and *what He has promised*. So, with this definition, discuss the questions below.

- 1. Romans 5:2 says that Paul rejoices in *the hope of the glory of God*. What is this glory referring to? Tony suggested that Romans 8:18-30 explains this glory. Read through that passage and discuss the usages of the word glory and hope.
- 2. Paul also rejoices in his sufferings because it actually builds his hope. Read Romans 5:3-5 and discuss the chain of words (suffering endurance character hope) and how each one builds on the other.
 - → Do you find in your experience that your suffering leads to a greater hope?
 If not, why?
 - → What lies might you be believing that would thwart God's purpose in building your hope?
